The Vine

One of the most empowering pictures in the Gospel is that of the vine in John 15. Especially in these times when there is such a massive and overt effort to undermine the integrity of the individual – this picture of the vine can give us great inner courage to live a fruitful life and really make a difference in our own local circle of influence.

What does it mean to live a fruitful life? Our whole task as a human being is to play a role in transforming ourselves, the society around us and the earth itself from its fallen state into a more whole and healed state of being. "Fallen" in this context means disconnected from its primal spiritual origins and spiritual content. The healing process is therefore one of reuniting – which is why at the root of all healing processes is the mysterious world of relationship. Our task as fruitful human beings is therefore to create living relationships with our own bodies and with everything that surrounds us – the natural world, the social world and the spiritual world.



A living relationship in this sense is one in which there is something living in between the two parties which nourishes both. I cannot bring this about without changing how I am within myself. This change includes embodying a deep interest and respect for the other; the need to be in a space which is able to give and not only receive; the need to be totally accepting of what is and at the same encouraging of what wants to develop and grow. In short, I need to practice real love – and here I find that I have a huge deficit of capacity. I simply cannot do this out of a big and willing heart. I am far too small for the task especially when I don't like the one that I must now love!

It is when I come to realize this that the picture of the vine becomes such a wonderful orientation for my everyday life. In the picture that Christ gives of the vine, I am not the vine itself, nor am I the gardener or the fruit. I am a humble branch which unless it is connected to the vine and thereby allows the sap of the vine to flow through it, is totally unable to fulfil its task of bringing any fruit into existence. It is in effect useless to the gardener and so is cut off and burned.

Christ is the vine – and the sap that flows through his being is the creative stream of cosmic love which brought everything that we see into existence. It is the stream from which we became more and more separated through the effects of the fall and to which we need to re–connect if healing is to take place. When I see my role in life as a branch which can willfully allow this flow to take place, then my own smallness becomes irrelevant. What flows through me is the most powerful thing that exists and so anything becomes possible.

My most important task becomes staying connected to the vine of Christ in my thinking and in my feeling. He then can unite with my will and so becomes the content of what weaves between me and everything else as a healing impulse and which brings about the fruitfulness of my life.

In this state of connectedness there is no space or need for fear.
